The Role of the Information and Communication Technologies in the Dissident Movement of 1960s-1970s

My PhD project is focused on the role of information and communication technologies in the Soviet dissident movement of 1960s-1970s. I am interested in how dissidents built communication channels and what type of technology they used for dissemination of information. Since Open Society Archives hold solid data on dissidence, I am very grateful I had opportunity to come and conduct my fieldwork research here. I am very grateful that Visegrad scholarship could assist me with it. It was a great honor to become a part of OSA community. I would like to cordially thank Katalin Gadoros, Nora Ungar, Anna Mazanik, Judit Hegedus and other colleagues at OSA for helping make this trip as productive and wonderful as possible.

My work at OSA gave me deeper understanding on how Soviet dissident movement functioned, and what kind of information was disseminated among participants. I had a chance to look through Samizdat Archives (HU OSA 300-85), which contain 16 different categories of materials. Among all of them, with kind navigation from Anna Mazanik, I could identify documents that could be helpful for me: Administrative files (HU OSA 300-85-47), which contain 17 archival boxes. Every box represents correspondence materials disseminated between Radio liberty samizdat research staff and contributors and recipients of samizdat materials.

The main objective of my research is to understand how media technologies were used among dissidents, what role the availability of technology played in the creation of their underground media, so finding materials that can provide information about sources and recipients of samizdat materials can be very helpful for building the map of information and communication flows. The ways in which they built communication channels are crucial for understanding the role of the different communication strategies in organising and mobilising actors. The aim of the study is to find out whether dissident movement has much in common with the current media based social activism in terms of organising and mobilising participants of the movement, so I was looking for the data that could help understand how information circulated among the participants. I found correspondence materials, which represent letters, handwritten notes, memos, telexes, etc. Almost every document contains information about sender and receiver, so hopefully it will help to understand how information circulated. One of the biggest revelations from work at OSA is how intense was circulation of samizdat materials in the West. Finding these administrative files gave me a new understanding of scale of the dissident movement.

At the moment I am in the process of analysing collected data, and I would like to attach the register of documents I've done so far, based on the found materials. I hope that work at OSA archives will help me

answer my research question and also contribute to the existing scholarship on technologies in activism. Please find my spreadsheet attached as a separate file.
